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Dr Haywood is a Principal Clinical Teaching Fellow at Imperial College London's Faculty of Medicine, where he works within the Educational Partnerships Office. His work focuses on socially accountable medical education, curriculum design, assessment, admissions, and faculty development. He has a particular interest in ensuring that medical education is aligned to population health needs and workforce priorities.

Alongside his academic role, Dr Haywood is a Public Health Physician. In this role, he has worked across local government, NHS England, the UK Health Security Agency, and the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO), gaining experience in public health practice, health protection, workforce development, and global health policy. As a former National Medical Director's Clinical Fellow at Health Education England and NHS England, he led a range of national medical education projects, including the development of an innovative dual training programme in General Practice and Public Health, guidance for doctors working in virtual care settings, and initiatives to strengthen recruitment and retention in underserved communities.

His broader interests lie in health systems and workforce strengthening through competency-based education and demand-driven workforce planning. He has worked with the World Health Organization on public health workforce competency frameworks and has provided technical support to international workforce strengthening initiatives, including in Malawi.
