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Dr. Dionne Kringos, a primary healthcare expert, is an Associate Professor leading a Health Systems and Services Research group at Amsterdam UMC-University of Amsterdam. She also serves as Vice-Director of the Amsterdam Public Health research institute (APH). Previously a Commonwealth Fund Harkness Fellow, she specializes in health care systems and services performance measurement, management, and improvement.

With a PhD in Primary Healthcare Performance, her research addresses how countries can achieve high-performing health care systems tailored to socio-economic, political, cultural, demographic, and epidemiological contexts. Committed to evidence-based decision-making for sustainable health systems, she was a European Commission Expert Panel member (2016-2022) and now heads the WHO Collaborating Centre for Quality and Equity in Primary Health Care Systems.

She's also on the Council of Observers for Luxembourg's National Health Observatory (ObSanté). Collaborating with global organizations like the World Bank, OECD, WHO, and European Commission, she advises governments on health system strengthening.
