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Lisa Lehner is a health justice researcher at the University of Vienna and Health Programs Director for the NGO AmberMed, a Viennese clinic that provides medical care and social counseling to people without health insurance coverage in Austria. Connecting research and evidence generation with real-world advocacy, Lisa works actively on implementing more just and equitable policies for people who are particularly marginalized within the healthcare system, including people without health insurance, people who use drugs, people experiencing homelessness, people who seek asylum, sex workers, and LGBTQIA+ people - focusing, specifically, on gendered dimensions and the complex intersections of identities and lived realities of people on the ground. She is a health systems expert and an expert in qualitative, participatory, and interdisciplinary health research.

Lisa is also an alum of the inaugural cohort of the Women in Global Health (WGH) "Speakers Bureau" training program and was a member of the Young Forum Gastein (YFG) initiative, having received YFG scholarships in 2022, 2023 and 2024. She is currently leading multiple third-party funded research projects on antimicrobial resistance, benzodiazepine prescription and use, cancer care pathways, and human papillomavirus (HPV) care pathways, investigating systemic barriers for prevention, treatment access, and awareness.
