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Mircha Poldrugovac is deputy head of the Centre for Health Care of the National Institute of Public Health in Slovenia. Mircha graduated from the Faculty of Medicine of the University of Ljubljana in 2007, thus becoming a medical doctor. Following his internship at the Izola General Hospital, he worked as an advisor in the area of quality and safety in health care at the Ministry of Health of Slovenia. He began working at the National Institute of Public Health in Slovenia in 2011 and completed his specialist training in the area of public health in 2016. He was a researcher at the Amsterdam University Medical Centres between 2018 and 2022.

He participated in several projects in the area of quality management. He co-authored the Slovenian Strategy on Quality and Safety in Healthcare 2010-2015. He also contributed significantly to the preparation of a national framework of quality indicators in health care and of the annual reports on those indicators. Mircha co-authored several scientific papers in particular in the area of monitoring performance through indicators. Currently his areas of work also include health system performance assessment

Since 2022 Mircha has been a national expert for Slovenia, with Expertise France, contributing to the EU funded project "Resources Hub for Sustainable Investing in Health". This two-year project aims at strengthening the capacities of Austria, Belgium and Slovenia in reaching existing EU funds for undertaking key health reforms and investments, in effectively advocating at national and EU level for additional resources for health investment, while ensuring synergies and mutual learning between the three Member States.
