Dr Martin Prázný is a Professor of Internal Medicine at the 1st Faculty of Medicine, Charles University in Prague, Czech Republic. He currently serves as a Senior Consultant in diabetes, head of the Diabetes Unit of the 3rd Department of Internal Medicine, and deputy head of the Diabetes Centre of the General Faculty Hospital in Prague. Dr Prázný graduated from the 1st Faculty of Medicine, Charles University, in 1997. He completed his postgraduate studies at Charles University and obtained CSc scientific degree in internal medicine and a PhD in biochemistry. He published original papers on microvasculature, endothelial function and oxidative stress in diabetes and other endocrine disorders, and also in diabetes technologies. With his research group, he is now investigating the effects of glucose variability and glucose monitoring technologies in glycemic control and diabetes complications. He also intensively participates in postgraduate education aimed at the treatment of type 1 and type 2 diabetes and complex prevention of diabetic complications. In the hospital settings he is the head of department specialized on the the treatment of patients with complicated diabetes, extreme obesity and sleep apnea related disorders. Dr Prázný is a member of the Czech Diabetes Society, the European Society for Microcirculation, and the European Association for study of Diabetes. He is currently a secretary of the Czech Diabetes Society.
