







Slow global progress

Number of AIDS-related deaths, number of new HIV infections and incidence:prevalence ratio, global, 2000-2017 and 2020 targets







Number of people living with HIV accessing antiretroviral therapy, global, 2000–2017 and 2020 target








Global 90-90-90 Gaps, 2017










Key populations at higher risk of infection

Relative risk of HIV acquisition, by population group compared to the general population, global, 2017









Tuberculosis treatment for people living with HIV still low

Percentage of people living with HIV with incident tuberculosis who received treatment for both tuberculosis and HIV, global, 2000–2016








Global treatment gap for hepatitis C


Cascade of care for people living with hepatitis C virus infection, by WHO region, 2016
